

- Spreads by direct or indirect contact with droplets from an infected person.

MANAGEMENT OF COVID-19 ON BOARD

- Symptoms reported to medical officer
- Isolated in their own cabin
- Early recognition and close monitoring is key to its successful management

MANAGEMENT OF CLOSE CONTACT ON BOARD

- Operations: severely impaired
- Ship: unable to function
- Self monitor and Report
- Daily temperature screening, wearing mask

SUPPLY OF PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT ON BOARD

INTERACTION WITH SHORE BASED STAFF

CREW CHANGES

- Seafarers travel
- Restrictions and quarantine requirements in the country
- Quarantine and testing reequipments

TESTING

- Policies and availability of tests
- 14 days quarantine at embarkation
- Testing only form a small part of the overall risk:
 - Cannot be used to exclude all risk

EXTERNAL MEDICAL CARE

- Ships refused entry to port
- Seafarer refused to disembark for medical care
- Commenced remote consultations, medication and prescriptions
